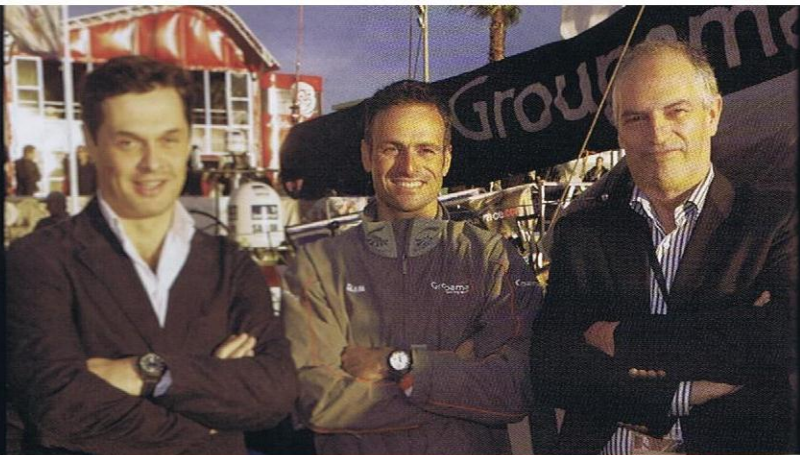

## JeanRichard's Gone to Sea

JeanRichard's Massimo Macaluso and Groupama CEO Jean-Luc Baucherel waved off Groupama's skipper Franck Cammas from the coast of Alicante when the Volvo Ocean Race got underway on 5 November last year. Covering a distance of 39,720 miles over eight months, the six participating teams will cross four oceans. JeanRichard, as Cammas's official timekeeper, will display the countdown between each audio and visual conversation between the race headquarters and the Groupama team. Cammas will wear a JeanRichard Diverscope for the duration of the race.



## The Only One for Meccaniche Veloci

Meccaniche Veloci has unveiled the Quattro Valvole Only One Collection, which, as the name suggests, is a collection of unique pieces based on Meccaniche's trademark model with four sub-dials. Continuing on the sporting theme, the Quattro Valvole Race has a dial created using metal from the motorbike fairing of GP racer, Casey Stoner's, Aprilia 250 (pictured). The Quattro Valvole Air features a dial incorporating a piece of the magnesium flap of an F104, one of the fastest military jet fighters. There will be a single timepiece made in both these designs for each of the four ranges – the Quattro Valvole Classic 48mm, Chronograph 44mm, Power Reserve 44mm and Three Hand 42mm.



## Edox Rallies Round

Already official timekeeper of the Class-1 World Powerboat Championship and official partner of the FIA World Rally Championship (WRC), Edox has just been appointed official timekeeper of the Dakar Rally-Raid. The Dakar Rally, founded in 1979 by Frenchman Thierry Sabine, attracts 600 participants in one of four categories: car, truck, motorcycle and quad. In 2012, the race will take place across Argentina, Chile and Peru.
